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Registration Requirements

✓ Be at least 18 years old ✓ Possess a current Alabama Driver License ✓ Provide a DOT Physical (Medical Long Form and Medical Certificate) ✓ Obtain a CDL Learner's Permit	✓ Complete the Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) Certificate ✓ Complete course online modules (theory) ✓ Provide negative DOT Drug Screen results* ✓ Provide a Motor Vehicle Report (MVR)*
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***Drug Screen results and MVR must be dated within 30 days of the class start date.**

Important Notes

- All required documents **must be submitted one week prior to the first day of class.**
- Students are subject to random drug and alcohol testing throughout the program
- **No High School Diploma or GED required.**
- Class A Refresher Training is available for qualified individuals when space is available.
